ACTT is an innovative approach that reaches out to severely and persistently mentally-ill adults who have not had success with traditional treatment programs. The program functions as a psychiatric hospital without walls and takes the treatment to clients at their homes, places of employment, community centers, or wherever they are. The goal of ACTT is to break down barriers and enhance the quality of life for those suffering with mental illness.
