About one-third of all homeless adults have served in the U.S. armed forces. Some of those veterans may be disabled with a diagnosis of post traumatic stress disorder or another combat related illness that makes it difficult to remain successfully employed and retain stable housing. To address those needs, Lutheran Services Carolinas provides transitional housing for homeless veterans and veterans at risk of homelessness. Kinard Manor in Greenwood provides transitional housing for up to 10 male veterans, and Angels House in Columbia provides housing for up to six female veterans. The objective is to provide these veterans with safety, stability, and the support they need to transition into independent living as soon as possible.
