Trinity Living Center Frequently Asked Questions

1. Will Medicaid or Medicare pay for adult day care?

No, though individuals receiving Medicaid through the CAP Medicaid waiver program are eligible for financial assistance for services. There are a number of resources to help with the cost of attendance. Contact the director (link to cjoyce@trinitylivingcenter.net) to learn more.

2. Are individuals with Alzheimer's disease eligible for enrollment?

Yes, individuals with Alzheimer's disease are welcome, as are individuals with other types of dementia or disability. Trinity Living Center has been specially designed to protect those at risk of wandering.

3. Are there individuals whose needs cannot be accommodated at Trinity Living Center?

Yes. Individuals who are under the age of 18, those who require tube or intravenous feeding methods, and some others cannot be served at TLC. An assessment is made of each individual at the time of application to evaluate the center's ability to accommodate the needs of the participant.

4. Do problems with incontinence prohibit enrollment?

No. TLC participants receive assistance with personal care as needed, yet must provide their own incontinence supplies.

5. Is transportation available for all participants?

No. There are some areas of Rowan County that vans are unable to serve. Also, participants riding the vans must be able to do so safely and comfortably. An assessment of each individual's ability to ride the van is made at the time of application.

6. What types of activities are offered at the center?

The center offers a rich variety of activities designed to meet the needs and interests of all participants. Adult education, games, arts, crafts, entertainment, exercise, outings, and community service projects are all available at TLC.
